but deliver us from evil. Amen


Setting Off

Prayer for Ash Wednesday


Grant, O Lord,

May your holy angels stay here and guard us in peace, and let your blessings be always upon us. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


May the almighty Lord grant us a quiet night and a perfect end. **Amen.**

I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.


I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you.
