

# Fr Dean Atkins, South Cardiff Ministry Area Leader, writes...

Two years ago, when we first celebrated Refugee Week with St Mary the Virgin Church in Wales Primary School, we had no idea what a transformative experience it would be for us. It was a week filled with joy and happiness, but it also included many more emotions as we stood alongside those seeking sanctuary.

By the time we celebrated Refugee Week last year, the number of refugees in our School Community had increased to 10% which was significantly influenced by many refugees being accommodated in local hotels.

During the week, we also celebrate 'The Great Get Together' from the Jo Cox Foundation, and we are now embedded in the 'More in Common Network.

If that isn't enough, the week also includes Windrush Day on June 22, a celebration close to our heart. Our

community has a strong West Indies heritage. It is something we celebrate.

This year, our celebrations for Refugee week extend across the whole Ministry area, moving out from Butetown to include Grangetown and Splott as we build upon everything we have experienced over the last two years.

Here, we are committed to working for strong communities that are hospitable and welcoming. We want to help create a world of compassion, and to be able to explore what it means to be at home with one another, how we can inhabit a shared space of respect, openness and love.

I hope you'll be able to share in this week's celebrations, as we work together for justice and peace, deepen our welcome and hospitality, and create a place where everyone can find a place to call home.

Refugee Week is the world's largest arts and culture festival celebrating the contributions, creativity and resilience of people seeking sanctuary

The theme for Refugee Week 2024 is 'Our Home'. From the places we gather to share meals to our collective home, planet earth: everyone is invited to celebrate what our Our Home means to them. Together, this Refugee Week let's practice our solidarity and make Our Home a more welcoming, safe and sustainable place for all.

Home can be a place of refuge, a feeling or a state of mind. It can be found in smells, tastes and sounds. From the clothes we wear to the words we grew up with. It's in food, music and arts. It's in our cultures and in our landscapes.

Home can be more than one place and finding it can be a journey, as it is for

so many of us who have to leave our countries and rebuild our lives.

Sometimes we can find home in a single person. Other times it's in a whole community. And often, it's in a single gesture of care and welcome.

What would happen if this Refugee Week we extended our warmth and hospitality beyond our own homes and made entire neighbourhoods more welcoming? Together, we can work in solidarity to ensure all our neighbours, new and familiar, have safe and welcoming homes.

Our home is also global. We are interconnected; we share the earth's resources, climate and its challenges. As we speak, millions of people are being displaced from their homes because of the climate crisis. But, exchanging knowledge, both new and traditional, can help us in practical ways to build hope for the future.



The Great Get Together (21-23 June 2024) is the UK's annual celebration of everything that unites our communities, inspired by Jo Cox's belief that we have more in common than that which divides us.

The need to celebrate unity and reject division is as relevant now as it was when the first Great Get Together took place in 2017. This June, on what would have been Jo's 50th birthday, we hope her message will continue to inspire our communities to bring people together.

Since its first year in 2017, the Jo Cox Foundation has run the Great Get Together every June, in which hundreds of community events across the UK take place on the weekend closest to Jo's birthday. These events celebrate unity and reject division, bridging divides and demonstrating our shared humanity.

This is now the third year that South

Cardiff Ministry Area has been involved, and we love being part of the More in Common Network.

The More in Common Network is a collection of groups and partnerships across the UK who champion Jo Cox's powerful 'more in common' message to bridge divides in their communities.

Through the Network, we're building a movement of people who are skilled and confident in identifying and bridging divides. While the Network is made up of different groups and partnerships, we are united by a shared 'more in common approach' that emphasises connection across lines of difference and demonstrates unity and cohesion.

With events taking place across Cardiff, we also have some hyperlocal events in Butetown, Grangetown and Splott, including our Barbecue on Sunday June 23 which will wrap up and celebrate all we have experienced during the week.



Windrush Day marks the anniversary of the arrival at the Port of Tilbury, near London of Empire Windrush and her 1027 passengers from the Caribbean, who disembarked on 22 June 1948.

It encourages communities to celebrate those who came to the UK from Caribbean islands and other Commonwealth countries after a call for people to fulfil the post-war labour shortage.

The arrival of the Empire Windrush marked an important moment in Britain's history and has come to represent the rich diversity of this nation.

Those who arrived on the Empire Windrush, their descendants, those who came before them and those that followed after them, have all made, and continue to make, an enormous contribution to Britain and Wales, not

just in the vital work of rebuilding the country and public services following WWII but in enriching our shared social, economic, cultural and religious life. The national day was announced in 2018 to honour people arriving in the UK between 1948 and 1971 from Caribbean and other Commonwealth countries who have been labelled the Windrush Generation following the scandal resulting from the UK Government's "hostile environment" policy.

This saw a number of people wrongly detained, denied benefits and losing access to the NHS. Overcoming great sacrifice and hardship, the Windrush Generation and their descendants have gone on to lead the field across public life, in business, the arts and sport. Wales and Britain would be much diminished without their contribution and that of all those that came from the Caribbean Islands both before and after them.
